

WEEK 15: Reminders:

- Select work for your powerpoint (good quality images- this may mean re-taking photographs), fill-in image captions and statement.
- Saving your PowerPoint as a pdf on your desktop or in OneDrive and send via email/Onedrive link to both lecturers (refer to Ben's video on the Maps and Dioramas page of nas drawing website).
- Disseminate images of your work via social media using the hashtag #nasfirstyeardraw and #nasstudiosessions.

- You will receive your mid-year review result/feedback via email from your observational teacher. Students should 'reply all' to this email with the acknowledgement: "Mid-Year review result received." That helps us to record that you have received your result. Next semester in the first week back (wk 16), your Observational lecturer will also ask you if you received your review result and record this on their roll.

- All students will receive their mid-year review result via email before the commencement of semester 2.

- Your mid-year review is like a formative assessment, it's low stakes in that it has no point value towards assessment. It mainly helps us and you to identify strengths and weaknesses and target areas that might need attention, it also helps lecturers know when students are struggling. As you are aware- the mid-year review focuses mainly on your engagement. We feel it would be unfair to judge your work based on other learning outcomes considering the situation. We also acknowledge that even this one criteria 'Engagement' can be challenging in the circumstances.

We remind you to keep all your work protected and stored safely as you will need to present it at end of year assessment. You don't need to present your diorama for assessment but it's a good idea to include some good quality images of it in your sketchbook/research file.
